2. FACILITATORS

The positions of chair and commentator have been combined into that of "Facilitator," who will introduce the panelists, spend a maximum of five minutes drawing out the main themes and issues after their presentations, and help to stimulate discussion with the audience.

3. NEW FORMAT - "FORUM"

A block of nine sessions has been designed to take advantage of the electronic pre-distribution. In these sessions, those attending will be expected to have read the papers, facilitators will open with a ten-minute commentary, panelists will have only five minutes to present their papers, and the remainder of the time will be devoted to discussion.

4. TIGHT TIME LIMITS

To ensure the maximum time for discussion, independent timekeepers will be appointed to each session to make sure that the following time limits are strictly maintained:

- 15 minutes for regular paper presentations
- 10 minutes for roundtable presentations
- 5 minutes for facilitators' comments in regular sessions and roundtables
- 10 minutes for facilitators' comments in Forums
- 5 minutes for paper presentations in Forums
