

## Tenure Track Position in Modern US History

We invite applications for a tenure-track position at the rank of Assistant Professor, beginning July 1, 2022, subject to budgetary approval. **This position is designated for Indigenous persons and members of Racialized Communities only.** The successful candidate will have or be close to completing a Ph.D. and should have a research and teaching profile in Modern US history (post-Civil War period). Particular area of research is open, with a preference for those studying ethnicity, race, and racism.

The successful candidate will teach undergraduate courses, as well as graduate courses in our Joint Master's Program with the Department of History at the University of Manitoba. The candidate is expected to have a scholarly record and a developed research agenda. The candidate will perform administrative duties and engage in committee work.

The University of Winnipeg is striving to lead the way in Indigenization and is an inclusive and diverse campus. It is also a member of the Newberry Consortium for American Indian Studies. The Department of History offers courses and fosters research in a wide range of areas, themes and eras: from Winnipeg itself to Canada and the Americas, and from Europe to Africa and Asia. With the addition of a Modern U.S. History specialist, we will continue to deliver a strong and vibrant curriculum focused on excellence, decolonization, accessibility, and innovation.
