Cover Photo

Usually, the program chairs of our annual meeting are faculty members of the university hosting Congress. This year is different, so we chose to use the program cover to illustrate one aspect of Trent University. This photograph captured a room of Lady Eaton College (LEC) called “The Pit”. It displays the interior of one of Trent’s 1960s buildings, renowned for their exceptional architecture, and it represents the student body of the time in a lively way. Established in 1968, LEC was first a women-only college, meant to “break new ground by affirming a positive ideal of the place of women in university life”. In 1972, the students voted to make their college co-educational. Incidentally, this is also a fitting image to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Canadian Committee on Women’s and Gender History, since the fellowship of LEC numbers a few present and past members of this association.

Habituellement, la direction de la programmation de notre réunion annuelle est assurée par un.e membre du département de l’université hôte du Congrès. Cette année constituant une situation exceptionnelle, nous avons choisi d’utiliser la couverture du programme pour représenter un aspect du campus de Trent. Cette photographie montre une partie d’une salle nommée « The Pit », située au collège Lady Eaton (LEC). Elle illustre bien l’intérieur d’un des bâtiments construits dans les années 1960, célébrés pour la qualité et l’originalité de leur architecture, et elle représente avec dynamisme le corps étudiant de l’époque. Fondé en 1968, LEC était d’abord réservé aux femmes et souhaitait innover en promouvant des représentations positives des femmes dans le milieu universitaire. En 1972, les étudiantes ont voté en faveur de la mixité dans leur collège. Par simple coïncidence, cette image permet aussi de souligner le cinquantième anniversaire du Comité canadien de l’histoire des femmes et du genre, puisque certain.e.s de ses membres ont aussi appartenu au collège Lady Eaton.

George Brown College Land Acknowledgment

George Brown College is located on the traditional territory of Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation and other Indigenous peoples who have lived here over time. We are grateful to share this land as treaty people who learn, work and live in the community with each other. We also recognize the City of Toronto land acknowledgement and other land acknowledgements that may apply to members visiting today and participating in Congress.

City of Toronto Land Acknowledgment

We acknowledge the land we are meeting on is the traditional territory of many nations, including the Mississaugas of the Credit, the Anishinaabe, the Chippewa, the Haudenosaunee, and the Wendat peoples and is now home to many diverse First Nations, Inuit, and Metis people. We also acknowledge that Toronto is covered by Treaty 13 with the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation.

Nous reconnaissons que le territoire sur lequel nous nous réunissons est le territoire traditionnel de nombreuses nations, notamment les Mississaugas de la Première Nation de Credit, les Anishinaabe, les Chippewa, les Haudenosaunee et les Wendat, et qu'il abrite aujourd'hui un grand nombre de Premières Nations, d'Inuits et de Métis. Nous reconnaissons également que Toronto est couverte par le traité n° 13 avec la Première Nation des Mississaugas de la Première Nation de Credit.





The CHA Congress office is located in WFL-501, and is open Monday through Wednesday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
