Finally, you will note that this year the CHA meets with the biennial Atlantic Canadian Studies conference and with the Canadian Catholic Historical Association. We look forward to the cross-fertilization of insights that will no doubt result.

Cette année, nous rompons avec notre tradition de longue date qui consistait à nous réunir dans le cadre du Congrès des sciences humaines.
